MONDAY EVENING WEBINARS, *EXPLORING THE POST-LOCKDOWN CHURCH:* Please go to <a href="https://postlockdownchurch.eventbrite.co.uk">https://postlockdownchurch.eventbrite.co.uk</a> for more information and to register these diocesan webinars. Tomorrow is Week 4. Fleur Dorrell, Director of the God Who Speaks campaign will be speaking on *The God Who Speaks in All Seasons*. She will be sharing stories about the different ways that people prayed with Scripture during lockdown and will give some inspiration for the months to come.

ONLINE CATHOLIC COURSES: The Academy of the Annunciation, run by two American female Doctors of Divinity is linked with, but separate from, the Bournemouth Oratory in Formation. They are currently offering two online courses which involve minimal time commitment: *Certificate in Reasons for Faith*, and *Diploma in Spiritual Formation*. Each course involves one two-hour session per week. These sessions are live and interactive via Zoom. There is a morning session and an evening session. Both sessions are the same, just at different times of day to suit busy people's availabilities. There is no obligation to do the graded assignments; people are welcome to join purely for personal enrichment. Due to popularity, registration for the *Diploma in Spiritual Formation* has been delayed until 23<sup>rd</sup> October; there is a week left (again, an extension) to sign up for the *Certificate in Reasons for Faith*. Alternatively, there will be a second run of the *Certificate*, beginning 11<sup>th</sup> January, 2021. Occasionally, through the year, they also offer one-off self-contained study days. ## **STANDING NOTICES**

FACE MASKS OBLIGATORY in church.

TO ALL THOSE STILL STAYING AT HOME: You are not forgotten! Please take all the time you need before you feel confident/are able to come back to Mass. To those who simply need a bit more reassurance that we are taking the necessary precautions, here are some of our measures:

- Pews are cleaned thoroughly before and after
- A distance of 2 metres is maintained at all times
- No shared literature; missalettes to be taken home and not left lying in church/given to someone else
- Obligatory face masks
- The Mass is much shorter so that there is less risk: short sermon, no bidding prayers, no music
- Everyone stays in their pew throughout the entire Mass; Holy Communion takes place at the end of Mass and all depart straight after.
- Your hosts for Holy Communion are sealed away before Mass starts and only opened again at the point of giving Holy Communion
- No dialogue at Holy Communion
- No refreshments and so no lingering
- Fr Anton sanitises during Mass as well as before; hand sanitiser available for all at entrance and exit
- Confessions heard outdoors by request; confessions in St Alban's Memorial Chapel with chairs placed side-by-side facing opposite directions and at right-angle (for those who want face-to-face). Standing is possible for those who do not wish to touch the chair. Face masks and sanitiser obligatory.

DO NOT FORGET YOU BELONGINGS! Holy Communion at the end of Mass is only a temporary measure which keeps movement in church to a minimum. It also prevents us from sliding back along the pews after reception which carries a risk of possible contamination. Please bring everything with you up to Holy Communion as you will be leaving the church straight away and not coming back inside.

IF YOU WISH TO SPEAK TO FR ANTON after Mass he will be available to speak to outside the church (in favourable weather!). Due to Covid, he will first have to go to the sacristy to remove his vestments before coming outside.

COLLECTION: For those able to attend Mass, there will be a plate for offertory giving as you leave the church (remember to use St Alban's envelopes only, for Gift Aid). Please use the envelopes, if you have them, in the usual way. Anyone who did not manage to pick up envelopes for the year before lockdown should be able to collect them from the church.
